A \$50.00 late fee will apply to all entries received after closing date. Entries must be complete by the closing date or a \$25.00 incomplete entry fee will be charged.

Haul-In: \$50 per/horse/day

Note: haul-in is assessed for all non-stabled horses, competing or not, for every day the horse is on the grounds, including warm- up days. Subject to double the fee if not declared and paid on entry. No haul-in required if boarder at SVE or

stabled at SVE during the show.

Non-compete:

\$100 per horse. Must pay either a haul-in fee or stabling and the CDFA and office fees. Fee is per show per

horse. Numbers are issued and must be worn while on showgrounds.

Other Show Fees: Medic Fee: \$10

RV with Hook up: \$70/day. Limited spaces. Electrical and water hookups, no sewer. Showers available. Must be on entry form.

If using an RV rental service, please indicate on entry day RV to be delivered.

Add/Change after closing date: \$20 per change.

Document Service Fee: \$25 If entry is lacking documentation, membership or horse recording cards.

All requests for change to an existing entry must be in writing.

New USEF membership rules go into effect on 12/1/2023. Please see GR rules GR 202, 205 and 206 for details. IN SHORT, coaches and Trainers MUST be USEF members at the time of entry submission, even if the Trainer is the parent of minor rider/owner. Non-member riders, drivers, handlers, vaulters, longeurs, owners, lessees, and agents are allowed to get ONE (1) Show Pass per competition YEAR, which must be applied for and paid on-line to USEF PRIOR TO THE SHOW.

Entries that do not include active USEF member numbers for ALL persons listed on the entry will be rejected. If you have a person that will be coaching you at the competition, they MUST be listed on the entry as "COACH" with USEF member number and MUST sign the USEF entry agreement form.



LAST DAY TO QUALIFY FOR THE CDS NORTHERN RAAC IS AUGUST 13th. SHOW CLOSES ON AUG 13th.

Competitors may enter classes on prior day, or classes on same day from Open Show class list for warm up classes. For same day warm up class, use the "Test of Choice" Class from the level desired. Only the Test of Choice class is guaranteed to be scheduled prior to the RAAC Class of the same level.

Mission:

The mission of these competitions is to provide an opportunity for all CDS Adult Amateur riders to qualify and compete against others of similar skills and experience. The regional nature of these shows will help provide our membership with a developmental path to gain competitive experience, to promote excellence and increase awareness of and support for CDS Chapters.

Goals:

- #1 For the Chapters: These regional level adult amateur competitions are designed to promote and enhance awareness and participation by the CDS Chapters, provide State level support in funding and advertisement, and a chance to generate funds at the chapter level.
- #2– For the Riders: These competitions will provide a positive introductory show experience for some, which will hopefully be a stepping stone to bigger things, while offering the other more experienced amateur riders an additional competitive experience.
- #3 For the whole organization, these competitions are designed to bridge the gap between the local Chapter shows with the individual year end awards programs and the tremendously difficult, top caliber competition at the Annual CDS Championship Show.

Qualification (Last day to qualify is Sunday August 16, 2021)


- 3 scores from 2 judges at USDF Introductory level Test C test 3 of 65% or higher at Novice Division Level only
- 3 scores from 2 judges at any Training Level of 60% or higher 3 scores from 2 judges at 4th level of 60% or higher
- 3 scores from 2 judges at 1st level of 60% or higher 3 scores from 2 judges at PSG of 60% or higher
- 3 scores from 2 judges at 2nd level of 60% or higher 3 scores from 2 judges at Intermediate I of 60% or higher
- 3 scores from 2 judges at 3rd level of 60% or higher

Nomination fee of \$25 per horse per level must be paid to CDS Central office 12 days prior to the competition.

Divisions:

Elite Adult Amateurs for riders that have competed in a CDS Championship Show.

Novice Adult Amateurs for riders who have never competed in a CDS Championship Show. All competitors will ride

PARKER EQUINE INSURANCE CDS REGIONAL ADULT AMATEUR COMPETIION (RAAC) 2023 ELIGIBILITY

- 1. Participants at the RAAC shows must be current members of CDS, must have a USEF Amateur Card under Dressage Rules, and must be 22 years old or older.
- 2. CDS membership for both the rider and the horse owner must be current when all scores are earned in order to count as qualifying.
 - 3. Qualification is for an amateur rider/horse team.
- 4. To be eligible to compete, the \$25 registration fee for each horse and rider team, per level, MUST BEPAID to the CDS Central Office by close of business no later than 12 days prior to the first day of competition at the regional show entered.
 - 5. Current Year Qualifying Opens: On the closing date of the prior year.
- 6. Current Year Qualifying Closes: 12 days prior to the first competition day of the show entered or by the Year End Qualifying Cutoff date for September RAAC Shows, whichever comes first.
- 7. Scores earned at the CDS Championship Show will NOT count towards qualification for RAAC purposes. RAAC scores do count for the CDS Championship Show provided all the other requirements are met.
- 8. Qualified horse/rider teams can compete AT ONE of the three regional RAAC shows held during the year. Eligible horse/rider teams are permitted to compete at ANY RAAC event. For example, a competitor can qualify in the southern region and opt to enter the central RAAC.
 - 9. Qualification scores must be earned at the CDS recognized shows and are as follows:
 - 3 scores from 2 judges at Intro Level test C of 65% or higher at Novice Level only
 - 3 scores from 2 judges at any Training Level test of 60% or higher
 - 3 scores from 2 judges at any First Level test of 60% or higher
 - 3 scores from 2 judges at any Second Level test of 60% or higher
 - 3 scores from 2 judges at any Third Level test of 60% or higher
 - 3 scores from 2 judges at any Fourth Level test of 60% or higher
 - 3 scores from 2 judges at PSG of 60% or higher
 - 3 scores from 2 judges at Intermediare I of 60% or higher
- 10. Elite horse and rider teams that have won either Champion or Reserve Champion at the CDS Annual Championship Show at Training and First Levels are not eligible to compete in the RAAC shows at the level they have won.
- 11. Winners of the RAAC classes; Training through Intermediare I, Elite or Novice, will automatically be considered qualified for the CDS Championship Show at the same level.

AWARDS

Award and neck sash to Winner and Reserve, bridle ribbons 3rd through 10th place in all Divisions and Classes.

Overall High Score award for Novice and Elite

Roses Award neck ribbons will be awarded in three divisions, Novice and Elite riders 50 years of age and older who officially sign-up for the division prior to their RAAC ride.

DIVISIONS: Basic through First; Second through Fourth; FEI.

RAAC Award Ceremony Requirements:

- The First and Second place riders in each class are required to attend the awards ceremony and get photos taken by the official photographer. Third to tenth place are also invited to participate in the awards ceremonies but are not required to do so to receive their ribbon.
- Horses and riders are expected to dress in proper show attire for the awards. White or Black polo wraps or boots are allowed, but not required.
- Classes held before noon with have their award ceremonies held at the lunch break. Classes held after lunch will have award ceremonies at the end of the show day.

STARR VAUGHN EQUESTRIAN INC Required Membership Information

All Starr Vaughn shows are recognized by USEF, USDF & CDS.

To participate, the horse <u>MUST have a USDF Number</u>. A USDF Horse Identification Number can be obtained by adding \$35 to your entry where indicated. Rider, Owner, Trainer & Coach must be members of USEF or pay a \$45 Show Pass fee. Rider and Owner must be members of USDF or pay the non- member fee of \$35.

Exceptions: Horses are exempt from USDF and USEF Registration for Opportunity, Introductory, Pas de Deux, and Quadrille classes. Riders/ Owners/Trainers are exempt from all membership requirements for Introductory, Opportunity, Pas De Deux, and Quadrille. If you have questions about required memberships, email the show secretary before submitting entry.

Eligibility to ride a USDF Regional Championship Qualifying test requires the following: Rider and Owner are ACTIVE USEF members, Owner is PARTICIPATING or BUSINESS member of USDF, Rider is PARTICIPATING Member of USDF, Horse is USDF Lifetime Registered, and USEF Lifetime or Annual Record-ed, These memberships must be in place at the time the scores are earned. The \$15 fee for the Qualifying ride must be paid in advance of the ride.

SHOW RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION

PLEASE READ CAREFULY

1. ENTRY ACCEPTANCE:

- As of January 1, 2019: ALL USEF Members 18 and over, participating in a USEF Recognized events, must have "Safe Sport" training certification. This pertains to Riders, Owners, Trainers and Coaches. Any entry that includes an adult that has not been "Safe Sport" certified will be held as un-accepted until training is completed. See USEF Website for more information.
- All entries must be received by the closing date listed in the prize list to be considered on time. Show management may close entries early if the show fills prior to closing date. Entries submitted after the show is full will go on the wait list. Competitors will be advised of their entry standing via an entry confirmation sent from confirmations@foxvillage.com. Entries submitted that are not accepted will be returned and refunded in full
- Entries must be filled out completely and have proper fees enclosed. Federation Agreement Page (signature page) must be signed by rider, owner, trainer, and if need coach. *Minors (riders under 18 years old) must have the parent or guardian sign the Federation Agreement. Missing signature pages, even for online entries, are considered incomplete and charged a \$10 incomplete fee.
- COACHES PLEASE NOTE: Please have all your students list you on their entries as COACH. This will help in scheduling to allow Hme between students when possible. (Possible to filter for COACH but not for "Trainer".)
- Incorrect or incomplete entries may be charged \$25 per correction and/or may not be accepted. This includes missing signature pages.
- Entries submitted without proof of memberships/registrations, are subject to a document service fee of \$25.
- No numbers will be issued without completed entries, full payment, signatures, fees and CURRENT copies of ALL registration cards.
- by ber for rider.
- Management reserves the right to accept conditionally or cancel any entries, disqualify riders as exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and cancel or combine classes.

2. ENTRY ACCEPTANCE (continued):

- Online entry available at EqEntries.com. Late entries accepted online only when space allows and with late fee, even if "Late e- Entries" are openly accepted.
- "Promise-to-Pay" entries not accepted by email, or phone. Late entries must be paid to be accepted.
- Entries are accepted on a first-come, first-served basis. This show accepts mailed and electronic online entries. Mailed entries are accepted based on the post mark date, and are only accepted on or after the opening date listed in the prize list. Online entries are accepted based on the date/time stamp of the paid submission. Should the show be over subscribed and the need to cut off entries prior to the closing date arise, entries received after the show fills will be notified and placed on a wait list. Ties regarding entries received at any time on the same day /time will be broken by lot prior to scheduling the show. Affected competitors will be notified. Entries not accepted will be returned and refunded in full.

3. Bio-Security Protocol

- Please note—this show has a BIO-SECURITY PROTOCOL. All STA- BLED Horses MUST provide documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Flu/Rhino pneumonitis) vaccina- tions within six months, and prior to 7 days of competition dates. Documentation must be submitted with show entry. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Manage- ment. See GR845.
- All NON-STABLED horse must be able to provide documentation of vaccinations upon request by management.
 Bring PAPER copies of vaccination records with you to the show.
- Show management must be notified if any vet is called to show grounds for any reason. Failure to notify show management may result in fine and/or being required to leave competition grounds.
- Show will have an Isolation Protocol in place. Any horse found to present a potential for transmittable disease will be required to follow the Isolation Protocol. Failure to follow Isolation Protocol may be fined and/or required to leave competition grounds.
- Bio-Security protocol does not negate the refund policy as outlined in this prize list.
- As part of bio-security—please bring your own water buckets.

SHOW RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION

- SCRATCHES, CHANGES and CANCELLATION REQUESTS MUST BE IN WRITING AND SIGNED: It is the responsibility of the competitor to inform the Show Secretary 916-869-7942 of the intention to scratch. Refunds are given for scratches **prior to closing date**, \$75.00 fee. No refunds given after closing date for any reason, including acts of God, weather, etc. No refunds on feed and bedding orders delivered. Please order before arrival. Morning orders will be delivered by noon. Refund of **USDF Qualifying Fees:** Scratches prior to show in which a full refund (less office and processing fee) is being made WILL include any USDF Qualifying Fee paid. Scratches that do NOT qualify for a full refund will NOT be refunded any USDF Qualifying Fees. Non-refunded USDF Qualifying Fees will be paid to USDF per USDF rules. No refund of USDF Qualifying fees for scratches made day of show. Changes to Entries: Changes made after the closing date will be assessed a \$20 fee per change. Cancellations: Shows will be held rain or shine. In the event that all or part of the competition is cancelled due to a storm, accident, air quality or other acts of God outside of show management's control or any other emergency, the competition will not be responsible for refunding entry, stabling, office or any other fees. Checks returned by the bank will be assessed a \$50 fee or the bank fees (whichever is higher) upon the first return and will not be run through a second time. A cashier's check or cash will be needed to clear the entry.
 - Equine diseases are known factors that could potentially impact the Organizer's ability to run competition as scheduled. USEF and the **EDCC** offer a notification system to advise of equine diseases that could affect your participation in a licensed competition. If the competition is cancelled due to a mandatory quarantine by CDFA or USDA prior to the show date, competitors will receive a refund of all show fees less \$100.00 to their original form of payment.
- 5. ENTRY CONFIRMATIONS: Entry confirmations will be emailed. Please ensure that your email is set to allow emails from confirmations@foxvillage.com. Competitors are responsible for reading and responding to the entry confirmation. If entry confirmation is not received by the closing date of the show, the competitor is advised to contact the show secretary.
- 6. RIDE TIMES: Times will be emailed, and available on the Fox Village website (www.foxvillage.com). It is the rider's responsibility to inform management if times are not received. Please do not assume lower levels will be run first, as it may be necessary to run classesout of order. Due to weather and other factors, upper levels may be scheduled earlier in the day than lower levels.
- 7. MANAGEMENT: The Horse Show Management reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of any incident in the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management and their decisionwill be final. The Horse Show Management reserves the right to re- fuse, accept conditionally or cancel any entries, disqualify riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and to cancel /award prizes, without claim to damage, to change, cancel or combine any classes, to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors, or to change rings or substitute officials. The judges decisions are strictly their own and the Management accepts absolutely no responsibility for those decisions. Management reserves the right to arrange for additional judges and to cancel, combine or amend any class, including but not limited to class awards, scheduling and location.

- **8. FREESTYLES:** Freestyle music must be e-mailed to SVEDressageShows@gmail.com by Thursday before the show. Sound check will be held prior to the start of the competition and at the firstbreak.
- 9. VIDEO CONSENT: SVE retains professional videographer. No other person or entity may charge for video recording rides at the shows. Anyone recording video of riders MUST have permission of that rider. No one is authorized to video without permission, no one may publicly post or publish videos without permission of rider/owner..
- 10. NON-COMPETE HORSES: Horses not competing in the show must be registered with the show office and will be given a number to be worn at all times when out of the stall. Entry form and signed Federation Agreement must be submitted, and appropriate fees must be paid prior to the horse being ridden. Failure to register and pay for schooling horse can result in doubling of entry fee. Non-compete horses are allowed in the warm-up as long as there is room and their presence is not disruptive. This determination will be made solely at the discretion of show management. There may be other areas on the grounds available for schooling purposes. No schooling of horsesin or around competition arenas during the competition. After the completion of the competition, with permission of show management, competition arenas may be opened for schooling. Due to limited stabling, companion/non-compete horses may be restricted.
 - 11. PONY MEASUREMENT CARDS: Competitors wishing to have their scores count for pony awards must include a current pony measurement card with their entry. If the competitor wants to have their pony measured by the TD at the show, they must let show secretary know two weeks in advance of show date. Management advises that if the on-call vet feels it is necessary to travel to a sick or injured horse instead of coming to the show to measure, the show will in no way be held responsible or liable for this decision on the part of the vet. Management will arrange for a measuring stick to be available. Competitor will be responsible for all vet charges, and any days incurred for rental of a measuring stick if required. Please call show secretary 2 weeks in advance if you need to arrange for pony measurement.
- 12. STABLING: See Page 4 for stabling types and prices. One bale shavings included. Stabling must be indicated on show entry and paid with entry fees. Please indicate ONE group name on your entry if in a stabling group. (Barn name works well.) Please indicate on entry time of arrival. Contact show secretary to arrange for early arrival/late departure. *Inspect your stall prior to move in. * We will do our best to ensure stalls are ready for you, please inspect and report any damageto stalls upon arrival. Do not cut, nail or hang anything from stall walls. Damage to stalls will incur a \$100 repair charge. Permanent stalls with doors are 12x12, Portable stalls with doors are 10X10. Bringyour own water buckets for all stabling.

The USDF Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program recognizes adult amateurs competing in equitation and promotes correct seat, position, and use of the aids in dressage. An Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class presented by Big Dee's Tack and Vet Supply will be held in conjunction with each of the nine USDF Regional Dressage Championship competitions, providing adult amateurs with additional opportunity for recognition.

Adult amateurs wishing to qualify to compete in an Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final may do so by meeting the following requirements.

Qualifying Requirements

To be eligible for the USDF Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class, rider must have

- a) Earned a score of 70% or higher in any dressage seat equitation class (except walk/trot) at a USEF-licensed/USDF recognized Dressage competition within the qualifying period of the applicable regional championship
- b) Qualified to compete in any regional dressage championship class (excluding freestyles).

Membership Requirements

- Rider must have a USDF Participating Membership at the time the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the
- Rider must be an adult amateur, in accordance with GR1306 of the USEF rules, and be designated with USEF as an adult
- amateur when the score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.

 Owner must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the
- Horse must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional

The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards.

RULES:

SHARPS CONTAINERS: GR1210.4 Competition

management shall place a minimum of one sharps container per each competition, whether or not stabling is provided.

Additionally, at least onesharps container per fifty occupied stalls for the disposal of nee- dles and other disposable sharp instruments in convenient loca- tions in barns housing competition horses. It is competition man- agement's responsibility to replace such containers when full and dispose of them properly. Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments. Competition management will place a notice of this requirement either in its prize list or on a specific handout given to trainers on check in at the competition. If local law has different requirements, local law will prevail.

Competitions failing to comply with placing the required number of containers on the show grounds will be considered in violation of the rules and may be subject to penalty as determined by the CEO or Executive Director and/or the Hearing Committee.

MOTORIZED VEHICLE STATEMENT: GR1301.7: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, in- cluding, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed com- petitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may oper- ate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

MORE RULES:

DR120 Dress:

WAIVING OF COATS: In locations with high average heat and humidity on the date of a competition, management can publish in their prize list that jackets will be waived for the duration of the competition. Alternatively, management can announce prior to or during a competition that competitors can show with- out jackets when extreme heat and/or humidity is forecast. This waiver applies to in all classes including FEI classes at National Competitions. However, competitors must wear protective head- gear and a shirt with sleeves and collar, without neckwear, and without decoration except as described under .14 of the rule. T- shirts are not permitted. Members of the Armed Services or police units may wear summer uniforms. (NOTE: For the show series Coats will be waived based on weather conditions and will be posted and announced at the show.)

HELMET RULE EFFECTIVE APRIL 1, 2013: From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse a any time on the competition grounds, including noncompeting riders, riders on non-competing horses, and those competing in all clas- ses and tests, including Para-Equestrian tests, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compli- ance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such head- gear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted. Unless jackets are waived, while in the competition ring, exhibitors wearing protective headgear must wear a short, dark jacket, dark tailcoat (only per- mitted for tests above Fourth Level), or Armed Services or police uniform (if eligible), dark hat covers (where applicable) and must otherwise conform to DR120 (see GR801).

Reminder: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org.

USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$45 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR222) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of over 100 independent organizations throughout the United States with a member-ship of nearly 30,000 members, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.


The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.

Greetings Competitors – Riders – Owners – Trainer – Coaches of the Starr Vaughn Equestrian Dressage Shows!

As you are all aware, the USEF has mandated biosecurity requirements for all shows due to the Vesicular Stomatitis (VS) breakout here in California. Vesicular Stomatitis is a viral disease of horses and other animals. Infection results in vesicles (blisters), crusts, and ulceration of the lips, muzzle, nose, tongue, ears, sheath, teats, and/or coronary band. Transmission is predominantly by Black Flies, Sand Flies and biting midges. The virus is in the active lesion, thus animals with active lesions can transmit the virus by direct contact, shared feed/water sources, and other carriers contaminated by infective lesions, vesicular fluid, and/or saliva. The lesions are self-limiting and typically resolve within 14 days. Humans can be infected from exposure to the virus and have mild flu-like symptoms.

USEF supports continuing competitions provided biosecurity measures are implemented.

USEF is mandating that:

All competitions institute immediate mandatory reporting of horses with VS lesions to competition management

All competitions require immediate isolation of horses with vesicular lesions or temperatures over 101.5 degrees F.

All Competitions immediately report horses with VS to State Veterinarians office AND to USEF Equine Heath and Biosecurity Veterinarian – Dr. Katie Flynn.

Starr Vaughn Equestrian BIOSECURITY Measures for the Dressage shows:

ALL HORSES ENTERING THE PROPERTY FROM CALIFORNIA MUST have an official timed certificate of Veterinary Inspection - a HEALTH Certificate - this must be a completed certificate - a note on letter head WILL NOT WORK - it must be an OFFICIAL Health/Vet Certificate which includes a VS statement and issued within 5 days of Entry to the competition grounds and must be completed by a licensed Veterinarian who has examined the horse (s).

UPON arriving at Starr Vaughn Equestrian Dressage facility – you must present your health Certificate to the representative that will then make sure that all horses in the trailer have a Health Certificate. You may have multiple horses on one certificate – but if arriving in separate trailers – make sure that each trailer has a copy of the Health Certificate. At this point – a trained representative will be inspecting EACH HORSE while still on the trailer. Using a new pair of disposable gloves for each horse – the mouth – muzzle – nose – ears – coronary bands - sheath and udders will be examined to be sure that there are no lesions. Once all horses are examined – if cleared – they will be allowed to enter stabling. This will be completed as quickly as possible – as we realize that we are working with possibly high temperatures. Again – we will all be working to make this process as quick as possible to secure the safety of all our horses.

ARRIVAL TIMES: Those arriving Wednesday – early arrival - please text Michele Vaughn at: **916-869-7942** to coordinate your arrival time - call when entering the property. (Same number)

Those arriving THURSDAY: We will begin inspections at 7am and will continue throughout the day until 5pm - if you plan on arriving AFTER 5pm - please call Michele Vaughn at: 916-869-7942 to coordinate your arrival time.

Those arriving only FRIDAY – SATURDAY – or SUNDAY please text Michele Vaughn with your estimated arrival time - 916-869-7942- call Michele Vaughn when you are entering the property (same number.) This way we know when you are arriving, and we will have a designated trained representative available to inspect horses – thus trying to make the process as guick and easy as possible.

HAUL INS - please text Michele Vaughn with your estimated arrival time -916-869-7942 - please call Michele Vaughn (same number) when entering the property EACH DAY. We will have a designated area for all Haul ins - but you must be inspected EACH DAY of arrival.

WE highly SUGGEST that all go to USEF.org and take the USEF online VS educational Module. It is a 16-minute video with a quiz at the end. The information is a wonderful way to educate yourself about this outbreak and how best to limit the spread of VS. We also highly suggest that everyone be sure to bring and use Fly spray at the event - again – this is spread most commonly by Black Flies. DURING COMPETITION:

ALL HORSES STABLED ON THE SHOW GROUNDS AND HAUL INS – ARE REQUIRED TO TAKE THE TEMPERATURE OF YOUR HORSES TWICE A

DAY! This is mandatory – and again a mandate from USEF and a requirement for us to be able to hold this horse show. A Temp Log will be given to you at Check in - it must be posted on your stall and you MUST Temp your horse twice per day - 1X AM - 1X PM. BRING YOUR OWN HORSE

THERMOMETER – as Temps must be taken – those not adhering to the stipulation will be asked to leave the competition. Again – all of this is to ensure that our horses remain safe – and it is a mandate in order to hold the competition.

Starr Vaughn Equestrian Biosecurity Protocols

Keep your horse(s) home, do not bring to SVE, if they have shown any signs of fever or illness in the 72-hours prior.

- SVE sanitizes all stalls between shows. We strongly recommend all you also sanitize the stalls prior to bedding your horses.
- Avoid animal-to-animal contact.
- Check and record temperatures twice daily with a unique thermometer per horse.
- Report any suspicion of illness in horses to Show Management and your vet, including a temperature over 101.5 F, or over 101.0 F if on a NSAID.
- Do not share any equipment between horses. Each horse needs its own brushes, thermometer, and alcohol spray bottle.

PLEASE DO NOT SHARE TACK!

- When filling water buckets, DO NOT dip the end of the hose in each bucket. Hold the hose above the water when filling.
- Wash/sanitize hands thoroughly before and after direct horse contact.
- Limit human-horse contact.
- Because humans can be an indirect means of disease transmission, avoid moving between barns unless necessary.
- Limit use of communal areas such as cross-ties and wash racks and do not use adjacent ties or racks when another horse is present.
- Do not graze horses on lawn areas.

USEF EQUINE VACCINATION REQUIREMENTS

GR844 Equine Vaccination Rule

- 1. At Federation licensed competitions horses, more than 7 months of age, entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine manufacturers' or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian.
- 2. In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations; name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration. © USEF 2022 GR8 19
- 3. In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine; and date of vaccine administration.
- 4. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, steward, or technical delegate when requested.
- 5. Competition Management may not amend or enhance vaccination requirements without prior approval of the Veterinary Committee.

Reminders:

Competitors are responsible for all INSURANCE for themselves, employees, owners, horses, etc. Competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, agents or horses. They are strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad and to keep the policy current.

Exdhibitor is responsible to inspect stall and report pre-existing damage prior to using stall.

Please be aware that there may be extraordinary USEF rule changes that could impact the show. www.usef.org.

<u>USDF Membership Benefits:</u> USDF is dedicated to education, the recognition of achievement, and promotion of dressage. For details on member benefits, including educational programs, awards, and other opportunities, refer to the *USDF Member Guide* or the USDF website at www.usdf.org.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM
 identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program and the USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded but will NOT be counted towards Adequan /USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$80. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- On the USDF website: www.usdf.org. You can submit the application online or download the form.
- In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date accepted by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.



2023 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships

A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), and recognized by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year. The Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF website at www.usdf.org. Please refer to the 2023 USDF Member Guide for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying and Championships

All memberships and registrations/recordings must be correct and current at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Rider:

- Must have a USDF Participating* Membership (PM).
- Must have a USEF membership (Active or Life).

Horse:

- Must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR).
- Must have a USEF (Annual or Lifetime) Horse Recording.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s).
 A horse is not required to have breed registry papers.

Owner:

- Must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Active or Life Membership or Annual or Life Recorded Farm/Business). If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership and must be the owner of record with USEF and USDF.
 For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.
- * PMs are USDF members who join USDF directly. USDF Group Members (GM) are ineligible.

Minimum Qualifying Scores: One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for Training Level through Grand Prix, in three divisions: open, adult amateur and junior/young rider. FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider classes have only one respective division.

WHEREAS, I understand and acknowledge that activities involving horses ("Equine Activities"), including but not limited to the mounting, riding, walking, dismounting, grooming, training, handling, feeding, and otherwise being in the physical proximity of horses is a dangerous activity which produces a foreseeable risk of mortal or serious personal injury and/or property loss to the participant in such activity as well as to the person or property of others; and

WHEREAS, I understand and recognize and warrant that this Release, Waiver of Liability and Indemnity Agreement ("Release") is being voluntarily and intentionally signed and agreed to, and that in signing this Release I know and understand that this Release may further limit the liability of equine professionals to include any activity, whatsoever, involving horses, including death, personal injury and/or damage to property.

WHEREAS, I recognize and agree that the equine professional(s) at SVE has/have made reasonable and prudent efforts to determine my ability to engage in the "Equine Activity", and has/have sufficient knowledge of my equine and horseback riding skills as for me to relieve, release andhold harmless said equine professional(s) from any continuing duty to monitor my Equine Activities.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of being granted access and/or use of the facilities of Starr Vaughn Equestrian, Inc. a California corporation ("SVE") and for other good and valuable consideration, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, I agree as follows:

1. <u>Assumption of the Risk</u>. I hereby assume full responsibility for, and risk of, any death or bodily injury to myself or others (including, but not limited to, those matters set forth in the above recitals) and damage to or destruction of my property or the property of others, caused by my engaging in any Equine Activity either on the premises of SVE or elsewhere while working with an SVE equine professional, unless such bodily injury or property damage is attributable in full or in part to the gross negligence of SVE. 2. Release, Waiver of Liability, and Discharge of Claims.

- (c) I acknowledge that SVE requires me to wear AHSA approved headgear with a chin strap while jumping and requires me to wear a safety helmet while riding. I understand and acknowledge that the risk of head injuries and death are significantly reduced by wearing appropriate headgear. I hereby release, waive, and discharge SVE, including its owners, occupants, tenants, subtenants, licensees, employees, officers, directors, or agents and the respective affiliated entities or persons of any one or more of them, against any and all claims that I may now or in the future have for damages resulting from my failure to wear headgear while riding either on SVE's premises or at an offsite facility.
- (e) In accordance with such release, waiver, and discharge, and in consideration of being allowed to utilize and/or visit the SVE facilities, I promise not to sue or demand any money or anything else of value from SVE, including any of its owners, occupants, tenants, subtenants, employees, officers, directors, or agents and their respective affiliates or persons of any one or more of them.

Indemnification. A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. 
