Online Entries: Available at <u>www.equestrianentries.com</u> on opening date. Credit cards are only method of payment accepted. A 3.5% online convenience fee will be added to your total fees. **E-mailed entries will NOT be accepted.**

Mailed Entries: Checks or money orders in <u>US Funds only</u> will be accepted. Please make a single check/money order payable to California Dressage Society Foothills Chapter. For security, NO CREDIT CARDS accepted for mailed entries. Show entry must be postmarked by the closing date.

Entry is not complete until payment is received. Checks will be deposited upon receipt. No post-dated checks accepted. Dishonored checks or declined credit cards will require complete repayment prior to the show, plus a service charge of \$35. All outstanding fees must be paid before show packets are issued. No bridle number will be issued without full payment and completed entry, including signatures and emergency contact information.

Complete Entries MUST Include: USEF and USDF member numbers and signatures of owner/rider/trainer/coach or non-member fee(s) where applicable; USDF and USEF horse Registration/Recording number(s) (where applicable); horse vaccine record and a copy of a negative Coggins (if horse is from out of state) taken within 12 months of the show dates showing the same horse name as on the entry (GR907.4). A parent or guardian signing on behalf of a junior exhibitor does not need to be a USEF member. NDPC/SVE/Foothills Chapter Release must be included with each entry (page 35-36). Freestyle classes must include copy of qualifying test with entry. Ponies and small horses must include measurement card/paperwork. If a pony or small horse does not have a permanent or current annual measurement card, owners must notify show management to schedule a measurement appointment with Veterinarian at the show. USEF Waiver and Release of Liability (page 34) will be collected upon arrival.

Entries missing any of these items will be considered incomplete. Incomplete/incorrect entry fee is \$25.

Entries are accepted on a first-come, first-served basis based on postmark or online entry date and entries may be limited. Those entries postmarked after closing (oct 3) will be accepted at the discretion of the show secretary, based on space available and charged a \$35 late fee per show. Management reserves the right to refuse any entry. Entries may close early if time limits for judges are filled. Remaining entries will be placed on a Waiting List. **Late entries**, if accepted, must be complete and submitted by 11 a.m. the day before start of class.

Noncompeting Horses: Are welcome on a space-available basis. Owner must fill out an entry form with all release signatures, send a current Coggins if coming from out of California, provide proof of vaccination and pay noncompete fee per show, office fee per show, and a stall fee, but no USEF drug fees. Noncompete horses are still subject to and must comply with the Drugs and Medication rules and are subject to drug testing. Noncompeting horses must wear current issued bridle number when out of the stall. Noncompeting horses may only school in competition and warmup arenas after show hours.

Conditions of Entry: Every horse entered for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but the Horse Show Management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Horse Show Management, Facility and its Directors harmless for any loss or accident to his horse, horses or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise.

Scratches and No Shows: Competitors have the responsibility to inform the Show Secretary in the Show Office of their intent to scratch a ride prior to the scheduled ride time. Refunds are given for scratches prior to closing date less the \$50 office fee. No refunds given after closing date for any reason. Management reserves right to make exceptions on a case-by-case basis regarding refunds and scratches in exceptional circumstances.

Equine diseases are known factors that could potentially impact the Organizer's ability to run competition as scheduled. USEF and the <u>EDCC</u> offer a notification system to advise of equine diseases that could affect your participation in a licensed competition. If the competition is cancelled due to a mandatory quarantine by CDFA or USDA <u>prior to the show date</u>, competitors will receive a refund of all show fees less \$100.00 to their original form of payment.

NATIONAL DRESSAGE PONY CUP INFORMATION

Show Rules:

- The National Dressage Pony Cup and Small Horse Championships is a two-day competition: Oct 16th and 17th, 2021.
- Ponies and Small Horses may *not* compete in more than two consecutive levels, even with more than one rider.
- Ponies and Small Horses may not compete in more than three tests per day for National Level tests, or two tests per day for FEI Level tests.
- The two highest tests of each level are competed during the competition.
- Ponies compete in height restricted classes.
- Small Horses will compete in classes with horses over 16hh, but will be separated into a Small Horse Division for class ribbons and awards.
- Each Pony or Small Horse/Rider combination must ride a designated test each day at the level they are competing to be eligible for prizes:

- Readers are permitted Introductory through Fourth Level.
- Whips are allowed per USEF rules.
- The NDPC considers competitors to be Junior Riders at age 16 and under. Competitors are considered Young Riders from ages 17 to 21. To determine which division a rider is in, the NDPC uses the rider's age as of January 1, 2021.
- Please note that Juniors and Young Riders will be riding in classes together, but will be awarded separately based on division.

Show Requirements:

- All Pony and Small Horse/Rider combinations must be current members of the NDPC and have USEF Pony
 Measurement or NDPC Small Horse Measurement Forms completed and submitted before their class on Sat, Oct
 16th, 2021.
- Ponies, Small Horses, Riders, and Owners must be current members of USDF (or pay a non-member fee).
 Introductory riders are not required to be members.
- All Ponies, Small Horses, Riders, and Owners must be current members of USEF (or pay a non-member fee). If you
 are getting a pony measurement, USEF membership is required.
- There are NO QUALIFYING SCORES necessary to enter.

Musical Freestyle:

- Only one Musical Freestyle test is required to qualify for prizes.
- Musical Freestyle tests may be ridden on either Saturday or Sunday, or may be ridden both days.
- If a Musical Freestyle test is ridden more than once, the scores will be averaged.
- Musical Freestyle Champion and Reserve will be calculated using a weighted scale per level (See chart in the Breed Awards section).
- Champion and Reserve neck sashes for Open, AA, Jr/YR (under 16) and Jr/YR (17-21) will be awarded.

Pony Cup Awards:

- If a Pony or Small Horse/Rider combination was Champion at Introductory through Fourth Level at the NDPC Annual Show previously, the same Small Horse or Pony/Rider combination must compete at a higher level the following year to be eligible for awards. They may still compete at the same level but will not be eligible for awards. This refers only to Champions. Ponies with a different rider, or riders with a different pony, are still eligible.
- Each day, First through Sixth Place ribbons will be awarded for Open, AA, Jr/YR (under 16) and Jr/YR (17-21) at each level, for Ponies and Small Horses.
- Scores from Saturday's and Sunday's tests are averaged. Pony and Small Horse Champion & Reserve Champion through Sixth Place neck sashes will be awarded for Open, AA, Jr/YR (under 16) and Jr/YR (17-21) at all levels.

High Score Rider Awards:

- The highest score for a ridden test on Saturday or Sunday (excluding Musical Freestyle) will be used to determine results for Open, AA, Jr/YR (under 16) and Jr/YR (17-21) High Point Rider Awards.
- High Score and Reserve High Score will be awarded in each division.
 - High Score AA is sponsored by the California Dressage Society East Bay Chapter
 - High Score Open is sponsored by Cari Sipila

Breed Awards for Ponies and Small Horses:

- The Breed Award celebrates the diversity of Ponies and Small Horses represented each year at The National Dressage Pony Cup and Small Horse Championships.
- The top two tests of the level are used for eligibility. Scores from Saturday and Sunday will count (Musical Freestyle scores are not eligible). No additional classes need to be entered.
- All breeds of Ponies and Small Horses are eligible to compete.
- There is a Breed Award for all measured Ponies and Small Horses that do not belong to a registry: The Grade Breed Award.
- Breed Awards for Ponies/Small Horses whose registries have sponsored include a neck sash and a choice of: 1) a custom-sized embroidered wool cooler, 2) a custom-sized embroidered mesh scrim sheet, or 3) an embroidered stallbanner. Lusitano Champion at each division (Jr/YR, Amateur, Open) sponsored by Christy Cadwallader.
- Ponies and Small Horses whose breed registries did not sponsor their Breed Award will receive a neck sash from the NDPC.
- Registration papers must be sent in with entries or presented to the Pony Cup Show Office before Sat, Oct 16that noon.
- If no breed is declared, the Pony or Small Horse will compete for the Grade Breed Award.
- Degree of difficulty points (see chart) will be added to the average scores to determine the Breed Award Champions.

Rachel King Perpetual Trophy and Award:

The Haflinger Small Horse or Pony with the highest single score (with degree of difficulty points added) over both
days will receive this award. Freestyle scores are not included. There are no height requirements for this award.
Breed papers must be submitted.

Neil Sorum Perpetual Trophy and Award:

• The Fjord Small Horse or Pony with the highest single score (with degree of difficulty points added) over both days will receive this award. Freestyle scores are not included. There are no height requirements for this award. Breed papers must be submitted.

Power Play Perpetual Trophy and Award:

• The Arabian Pony with the highest single score (with degree of difficulty points added) over both days will receive this award. Freestyle scores are included. Must be a Pony and registered with the Arabian Horse Association (AHA). Breed papers must be submitted.

Avatar's Jazzman Perpetual Trophy and Award:

• The Morgan Small Horse or Pony with the highest single score (with degree of difficulty points added) over both days will receive this award. Freestyle scores are not included. There are no height requirements for this award. Breed papers must be submitted.

Arabian Sport Horse Alliance Perpetual Trophy and Award:

The Arabian-bred Small Horse or Pony with the highest single score (with degree of difficulty points added) over both days will receive this award. Freestyle scores are not included. There are no height requirements for this award. Arabian-bred is defined at an Arabian, Anglo-Arabian, Shagya-Arabian, or part-bred in any registry with at least one grandparent that is one of those three breeds. Papers must be submitted.

President's Choice Award:

• The President's Choice Award is given each year to acknowledge a competitor or organization who exemplifies the spirit of the National Dressage Pony Cup. With this award we honor extraordinary enthusiasm, perseverance, and dedication furthering the participation of ponies and small horses in the sport of dressage.

National Dressage Pony Cup Futurity:

- The NDPC Futurity recognizes the talents of young Ponies and Small Horses as they progress through the levels
- The top two tests of Training, First, and Second Levels are competed for 4, 5, and 6-Year-Old Ponies and Small
 Horses, respectively. These tests are used for eligibility in Pony Cup AND Futurity Awards. No additional tests need
 to be ridden.
- Nomination Forms and a non-refundable \$50 Nomination Fee must be made in advance of competition on Friday to be eligible for the Futurity.
- Awards will be given in three categories: 4-Year-Olds, 5-Year-Olds, and 6-Year-Olds. Awards will not be separated
 into rider divisions.
- Scores from competition on Saturday and Sunday will be averaged for the total score.
- Ribbons will be given First through Sixth Place.
- Payback money will be given First through Fourth place. Prize money will be paid by check by the end of the show or be mailed within 30 days if the competitor has left before checks are issued.
- 100% of the nomination fee will go into a combined purse, and will be awarded by the following percentages: First 40%, Second 30%, Third 20%, Fourth 10%.
- There will be an additional Born in the USA ribbon given to the highest scoring American born and bred Pony or Small Horse at each level.

Great American Insurance Group (GAIG)/USDF Qualifying Classes:

- Indicate the class entered is to count for qualifying by placing a **Q** after the class number on your entry. Qualifying does not require a separate ride.
- An exhibitor riding in the Open, AA, Young Rider, or Junior classes must pay an additional \$15 USDF qualifying fee to have this score entered in the GAIG/USDF qualifying division at that level.
- Riders must have an active USEF Membership and a USDF Participating Membership. Owners must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Junior Active, Senior Active, Life, or Recorded Farm(with Active Farm Owner)).
 - o If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership. For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.
- HORSES must be Annual or Lifetime Recorded with USEF and USDF Lifetime Registered or have HID number (Lifetime Registration required for GAIG qualifyin rides)

PONY AND SMALL HORSE MEASUREMENTS

Scheduling Measurements:

- Ponies and small horses not possessing a current temporary or permanent measurement must be measured before their first ride. We recommend having your pony or small horse measured prior to the show. While measurements will be offered at the show, the show does not guarantee that the measurement can be performed prior to your class. Therefore, it is recommended to have the measurement completed prior to arriving at the show.
- Please specify that you need your Pony or Small Horse measured on your entry form and a measurement time will be assigned.
- Measurement forms (USEF Pony and NDPC Small Horse) will be provided upon arrival and check-in at the ShowOffice.
- Measurements will take place Fri, Oct 15th starting at 4pm and are free of charge. If another time is required, arrangements must be made with management, TD, and veterinarian. A reminder of time and place for measurement will be posted at the Show Office on Friday Oct 15th.

Pony Measurement Information:

- Any pony being ridden in a pony restricted class must possess a USEF Dressage Pony Measurement Card. A copy of the Federation Standard or Temporary Measurement card must be submitted with the entry for each pony possessing a Measurement card and competing in Dressage tests/divisions limited to ponies. The original measurement form, or a scanned copy of the original form, may be submitted as proof of measurement.
- If a pony, age three or over, is not in possession of a fully and correctly completed Measurement card, the Competition Management must order the pony to be measured by the Dressage Technical Delegate and the Competition Veterinarian pursuant to GR505, GR506, and GR508. Failure to allow the pony to be measured will result in the pony being disqualified at that competition *from competing in pony classes or tests or for awards limited to ponies*.
- A pony measurement is required for any horse under 8 years old which does not have a permanent or a current temporary pony measurement card.
- The show TD will provide Pony competitors the USEF Pony Measurement Forms. DO NOT print them and bring them with you.
- Pony must be presented in a halter with bridle number attached.
- Ponies will be jogged in front of the show veterinarian.
- Owners must be USEF members at the time of measurement. Ponies must have a USEF recording or HID #.

Small Horse Measurement Information:

- A Small Horse, as designated by the National Dressage Pony Cup, is any breed of horse or pony that measures taller than a pony, but less than 16hh with shoes. The official NDPC range is more than 149cm, to less than 163cm with shoes.
- Small Horses over 3 years of age must have a current NDPC Small Horse Measurement Form submitted to the NDPC prior to the start of competition on Oct 16th.
- Small Horses 8 years and older will be considered permanently measured. Small Horses under 8 have a temporary measurement status and must submit a new NDPC measurement form each year.
- Small Horses without a current NDPC Small Horse Measurement must be measured before their first ride. Small
 Horses may be measured by a licensed, practicing veterinarian who is required to sign and verify the measurement.
 Or, if measured at the Annual Show, the person designated to measure small horses.
- Small Horses are to be presented in a halter with bridle number attached.
- NDPC Small Horse Measurement Forms will be provided at the time of measurement to Small Horse competitors.
- Small Horses will not need to be jogged, only measured.
 - All measurement rules and requirements are governed by USEF for Ponies and by NDPC for Small Horses.

OPEN SHOW CLASS AND AWARDS INFORMATION

Awards for Open Show Classes:

Ribbons to fifth place for each class. Divisions (Jr/YR, AA, Open) may be run concurrently as one class. Riders may enter only one division per class. Divisions may be pinned separately. Riders must clearly specify division choice. When no designation is made, riders will automatically be entered as Open. Only one set of ribbons will be awarded for those classes with *only* the Open division. When classes are Posted as final online, you may pick up your ribbons. Paper results pages may be posted.

High Point Awards:

- Awarded for the highest percentage in each division (Open, AA, and JR/YR) Introductory through GP.. (Materiale, Equitation, Opportunity, Young Horse, Freestyle, Para, Pas de Deux, and Quadrille classes are not eligible.)
- High Score and Reserve High Score will be awarded in each division.

Amateur (AA) Classes:

- Individuals possessing current amateur certification are only eligible as Adult Amateurs from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach age 22.
- Only active United States Equestrian Federation (USEF) members may obtain amateur status. (Exception: Equine Canada members in possession of current EC membership may sign for USEF Amateur status on a show-by-showbasis at no cost).
- Participants must possess current USEF Amateur status and qualify under the USEF Amateur rules
- If opportunity classes at Dressage Competitions are restricted to amateurs, riders are required to have amateur status with USEF.

Junior/Young Rider Classes (Jr/YR):

- Riders are eligible to compete in these classes until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 21.
- Please note that Juniors and Young Riders will be riding in classes together but will be awarded separately based on age: Jr/YR (under 16) and Jr/YR (17-21).

Open Show Pony Division: For measurement requirements, see page 10

- The Foothill Fall Classic Open show is an official Partner Show with The National Dressage Pony Cup and therefore offers pony classes that are NOT part of the NDPC Championship.
- Ribbons will be given for 1st through 6th place and High Score in Pony-Only classes.
- After degree of difficulty per test is added, a ribbon and certificate will be awarded to the Champion Pony by the NDPC. This only applies to the Pony classes and Pony Freestyle classes.
- For this competition, classes are offered from Introductory Level through Fourth Level and FEI, with classes designated for the Jr/YR, Adult Amateur, and Open riders.

Classes per Day:

Horses are limited to a maximum of three Dressage rides per day at Fourth Level and below or two Dressage rides per day above Fourth Level. Horses competing at both Fourth Level and Prix St. Georges, or their equivalents, are limited to two Dressage rides per day. Dressage Seat Equitation, Pas de Deux and Materiale classes are excluded from the maximum limit of rides per day and horses in these classes may compete at any level for whichthey are otherwise eligible during the same competition.

Consecutive Levels:

 Horses may enter no more than two consecutive levels, Freestyle levels included, at any one competition. Refer to DR119.2 for levels chart.

Scores:

It is the responsibility of the competitor to verify the accuracy of all scores. Scoring errors must be reported to the Show Secretary within one hour of the official posting of the scores from the last class of the show day during which the score was earned.

Dressage Seat Medal Program:

The USEF/USDF Dressage Seat Medal Program, for riders ages 18 and under, celebrates excellence in equitation and strives to develop a solid foundation for future success in the dressage arena. Riders wishing to qualify for the USEF Dressage Seat Medal Finals must compete in the USDF Dressage Seat Medal Semi-Finals held at the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Championships. To qualify for the USDF Dressage Seat Medal Semi-Finals, a competitor must earn a qualifying score of 70% or above in any eligible Dressage Seat Equitation class (except walk/trot) held at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized dressage competition during the qualifying period or by qualifying for the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Championships. The top two placing riders in the Semi-Finals are automatically invited to the Finals. More information can be found here.

USDF Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program:

Rider must be an Adult Amateur (age 22 and up) and have a USDF participating membership at the time the qualifying score is earned. Horse must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration when the qualifying score is earned. To be eligible for the USDF Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class, rider must have earned a score of 70% or higher in any dressage seat equitation class within the qualifying period or qualify to compete in any regional dressage championship class (excluding freestyles.) More information can be found here.

Ties:

• In the case of equality of points, the competitor with the highest marks received under General Impressions shall be declared the winner. When the scores for General Impressions are equal after coefficients have been applied, the horses must remain tied. Errors on a test may not be used to break ties. [DR123.3]

Great American Insurance Group (GAIG)/USDF Qualifying Classes:

- Indicate the class entered is to count for qualifying by placing a **Q** after the class number on your entry. Qualifying does not require a separate ride.
- An exhibitor riding in the Open, AA, Young Rider, or Junior classes must pay an additional \$15 USDF qualifying fee to have this score entered in the GAIG/USDF qualifying division at that level.
- Riders must have an active USEF Membership and a USDF Participating Membership. Owners must have a USDF
 Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Junior Active, Senior Active, Life, or Recorded Farm
 (with Active Farm Owner)).
 - o If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership. For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.

HORSES must be Annual or Lifetime Recorded with USEF and USDF Lifetime Registered, an HID is not sufficient.

MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

To participate, the horse <u>MUST have a USDF Number.</u> A USDF Horse Identification Number can be obtained by adding \$35 to your entry where indicated. Rider, Owner, Trainer & Coach must be members of USEF or pay a \$45 Show Pass fee. Rider and Owner must be members of USDF or pay the non-member fee of \$35.

<u>Exceptions:</u> Horses are exempt from USDF and USEF Registration for Opportunity, Introductory, and Pas de Deux, classes. Riders/ Owners/Trainers are exempt from all membership requirements for Introductory, Opportunity, and Pas De Deux. If you have questions about required memberships, email the show secretary before submitting entry.

Eligibility to ride a USDF Regional Championship Qualifying test requires the following: Rider and Owner are ACTIVE USEF members, Owner is PARTICIPATING or BUSINESS member of USDF, Rider is PARTICIPATING Member of USDF, Horse is USDF Lifetime Registered, and USEF Lifetime or Annual Recorded, these memberships must be in place at the time the scores are earned. The \$15 fee for the Qualifying ride must be paid in advance of the ride.

If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership and must be the owner of record with USEF and USDF. For a business or farm to be th valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.

It is the responsibility of the rider to inform the management of any time conflicts as soon as possible after receiving the schedule. **Official times** will be available by noon the day before the show. Stabling assignments and official times will also be posted at the show office on Friday Oct 15 at noon. This show follows USEF GR830 with regard to rescheduled ride times.

Any changes after closing date initiated by rider or owner may incur a change fee.

Schedule: Classes may not necessarily be run in the order listed in the class lists. See page 27 for Management rights.

Schooling: Will begin Friday, Oct 15th at 9 a.m. All competitors must have their current issued bridle number before riding. Schooling on Friday will continue until dusk.

Lunging only allowed in approved lunging areas (see signage).

Bridle Numbers: All horses must always wear current issued bridle numbers when out of stall.

Freestyles/Music: Music for all freestyles must be emailed to Noah Rattner at noah.g.rattner@gmail.com by noon Thursday Oct 14. Emailed submissions must be in MP3 format. Sound checks will be conducted Saturday during the first break.

DR129.9 Except for USEF/USDF Championship classes and for FEI Pony Riders, FEI Junior, FEI Young Rider and FEI Para-Equestrian Freestyles, in order to enter a freestyle class at any level, a horse/rider combination must have received a minimum score of 63% for Training through Fourth levels and 60% for FEI levels in the highest test of the declared freestyle level or any test of a higher level at a USEF/USDF licensed Dressage Competition or FEI recognized Dressage Competition or "open" Dressage class (i.e. open to all breeds) at a Federation Licensed Competition held prior to the competition where the horse/rider combination is entered to ride a freestyle class. Anyone mounting, getting on, riding or trying a horse at the facility during the weekend of the show (including warmup day) must sign a show release form in the Show Office if they haven't already included it in their entry.

VACCINATION, HEALTH CERTIFICATE, DOGS, AND LIABILITY INFORMATION

Equine Vaccination Rule: All equines entering this competition must provide with their entry, proof of current flu/rhino vaccinations within 6 months of the show BUT should be no later than 7 days before the show. Please read GR845 for full explanation.

Exhibitors should exercise extreme caution before medicating their horses and should be aware of the US EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION rules governing drugs and medications. Any questions about the use of certain medications and regarding Rule IV should be directed to the USEF Federation Equine Drugs and Medications Program, 956 King Avenue, Columbus, Ohio 43212-2655. (800) 633-2472, (614) 299-7707, FAX (614) 299-7706.

California Health Regulations: For out-of-state horses, please ensure you have the appropriate documentation for your horses. All horses entering Starr Vaughn Equestrian grounds from out-of-state, must have valid proof of negative Coggins test (within 12 months) and a 30-day certificate of veterinary inspection. Horses who fail to arrive with appropriate paperwork will not be allowed to unload on grounds.

Liability: Horses by their inherent nature present a risk. Neither the organizing/show committee (CDS Foothills Chapter and NDPC), the show volunteers and staff, the facility (SVE) or its owners, USEF or USDF or their members will be responsible for any damage, injury, loss to persons, horses, or property of exhibitors or spectators/attendees. All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

Each participant in an equestrian activity expressly assumes the risk of and legal responsibility for any injury, loss or damage to person or property which results from participation in an equestrian activity. Each participant shall have the sole individual responsibility for knowing the range of his or her own ability to manage, care for, and control a particular horse or perform a particular equestrian activity, and it shall be the duty of each participant to act within the limits of the participant's own ability, to maintain reasonable control of the particular horse or horses at all times while participating in an equestrian activity, to heed all posted warnings, to perform equestrian activities only in an area or in facilities designated by the horseman and to refrain from acting in a manner which may cause or contribute to the injury of anyone. If while actually riding in an equestrian event, any participant collides with any object or person, except an obviously intoxicated person of whom the horseman is aware, or if the participant falls from the horse or from a horse-drawn conveyance, the responsibility for such collision or fall shall be solely that of the participant or participants involved and not that of the horseman.

Accidents: A participant involved in an accident shall not depart from the area or facility where the equestrian activity took place without leaving personal identification, including name and address, or without notifying the proper authorities, or without obtaining assistance when that person knows or reasonably should know that any other person involved in the accident is in need of medical or other assistance.

Important Notice to All Affected Parties: Third parties may come upon the property or enter the facilities where any herein described or listed event will occur; provided, that this is a license to enter the premises, for the purpose of observing or participating in the event, but not otherwise, and such license to any individual is subject to revocation by the owner, lessee or organizer, and entry for any purpose other than granted herein, shall be deemed criminal trespass and subject to appropriate legal proceedings.

Dogs: Facility rules require that dogs must be on a leash (not to exceed 6 feet in length) or suitably restrained. Loose animals/animals left in vehicles in distress, etc. can and will be removed from the grounds at the owner's expense. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. Dog owners are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from their dog's behavior.

Warning: Under the Equine Activity Liability Act, each participant who participates in an equine activity expressly assumes the risks of engaging in and legal responsibility for injury, loss, or damage to person or property resulting from the risk of equine activities.

Weather/Acts of God/Accidents or Emergency Policy: Management reserves the right to cancel any classes due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, accident, or emergency. Every effort will be made to reschedule with priority given to Great American\USDF qualifying classes being offered. No refund for cancellations due to hazardous weather (including smoke), Acts of God, accidents, or emergencies. SeeUSEF rule GR305.4.

HORSE/RIDER MEMBERSHIPS

A **TRAINER**, as listed on the entry form, is defined as any adult (18 & older) who has responsibility for the care, custody or performance of the horse while the horse is on the competition grounds. This adult must sign the entry form as trainer. If the rider is considered the trainer, the rider must sign as the trainer. A parent or guardian signing on behalf of a junior exhibitor does not need to be a USEF member. A **COACH**, as listed on the entry form, is defined as an adult (18 & older) who gets paid for instructing, teaching, schooling or advising a rider with their horse on the competition grounds. This adult must sign the entry form as coach. If there is no coach, the signature for coach may be left blank.

USEF/USDF Horse ID Requirement: All horses entered in USEF/USDF recognized shows must at least have a USDF HID (Horse Identification) number in order to participate. If riding in qualifying classes, you must have a USDF Lifetime Registration in addition to a USEF Annual or Lifetime Recording. These horse identification numbers may be obtained from USEF and USDF. Exempt from this requirement are horses showing only in Introductory Level, Pas de Deux, Quadrille, Opportunity Classes, Leadline, and Exhibitions.

Membership/Non-Member/Proof of Membership Fees: All participants (rider, owner, trainer, agent, lessee, or coach) must present to the competition secretary a current USEF membership number. In the event the participant does not have his/her membership number, he/she must pay a \$45 USEF show pass fee per show. All Riders and Owners must present a current USDF Participating, Group, or Business (owners only) membership number or pay a \$35 USDF non-membership fee per show. Those who cannot provide proof of their USDF membership may fill out an affidavit form and must pay the \$5 fee. The affidavit may also be used to verify horse registration and/or horse ownership. The USDF Affidavit Form may be found on www.USDF.org. Exempt from this requirement are individuals competing only in Introductory Level, Pas de Deux, Quadrille, Opportunity Classes, Leadline, and Exhibitions.

Non-U.S. Citizens and Foreign Competitors: Must provide proof, in English, of current membership in good standing in their respective National Federation or hold current membership in good standing with the USEF. Equine Canada members in possession of current EC membership may sign for USEF Amateur status on a show-by-show basis at no cost.

DIVISIONS AND HORS DE CONCOURS

Class Division Explanations: Individuals are eligible as Jr/YR (Junior/Young Rider) until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 21. Individuals are eligible as Jr (Juniors) from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18 for the FEI Junior Tests. Individuals are eligible as YR (Young Riders) from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 21 for the FEI Young Rider Tests. Individuals are eligible as Children from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 14 for the FEI Children Tests. Individuals are eligible as Pony Riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 12 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 12 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 for the FEI Pony Tests. Individuals are eligible to compete as AA (Adult Amateur) from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 22 and must hold current USEF Amateur card. Open Classes - A class that is open to all. There are no restrictions based on the horse (age, sex, size, residence or membership of owner) or rider (age, experience, qualifications, sex, residence, etc.)

Riders Under the Age of 14: No rider under the age fourteen is permitted to ride a three-year-old colt, or stallion of any age, in any under saddle class including Dressage Sport Horse Prospect Under Saddle, Materiale, and Suitability classes. DR202.13

Pony Classes/Divisions: Open to all breeds that meet the following measurement requirements. A pony is an animal that does not exceed 148 cm without shoes and 149 cm with shoes. The pony can be of any sex (mare, stallion, or gelding).

Hors de Concours: DR119.5 Only with the permission of competition management may a horse/rider combination enter a class Hors de Concours. Such entries must pay the full entry fee but scores for these entries will not be published or recorded, nor shall they count towards any prizes, placings or year-end awards. Said permission must be granted prior to the start of the class(es) involved. Hors de Concours entries must follow all Federation General and Dressage Division rules that apply to other entries in the same class, except as described below. Having competed Hors de Concours at a competition, a horse is no longer eligible for further prizes, awards or placings at that competition except in situations of emergency substitutions of judges. Hors de Concours entries are not permitted in Federation/USDF Championship classes.

US EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION RULES

"EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT FEDERATION RULE
BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH."

US EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION rules are in force from the moment show management allows access to the show grounds. This includes conduct, correct saddlery and equipment, and attire.

USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT DR901.9 Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classesat Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$45 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR222) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA EndorsedReining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

MOTORIZED VEHICLE RULE In accordance with GR1301.7: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses oractions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

<u>Sharps Containers</u> Competition management shall place a minimum of one Medical Sharps Container ("Sharps") per each competition, whether or not stabling is provided. Additionally, at least one Sharps Container per fifty occupied stalls for the disposal of needles and other disposable sharp instruments in convenient locations in barns housing competition horses. It is competition management's responsibility to replace such containers when full and dispose of them properly. **Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.** Please do not use garbage cans for this material. If local law has different requirements, local law will prevail.

Waiving of Coats DR120 In locations with high average heat and humidity on the date of a competition, management can publish in their prize list that jackets will be waived forthe duration of the competition. Alternatively, management can announce prior to or during a competition that competitors can show without jackets when extreme heat and/or humidity is forecast. This waiver applies to in all classes including FEI classes at National Competitions. However, competitors must wear protective headgear and a shirt with sleeves and collar, without neck wear, and without decoration except as described under .14 of the rule. T-shirts are not permitted. Members of the Armed Services or police units may wear summer uniforms. (NOTE: For the show Coats may be waived based on weather conditions and will be announced at the show.)

Protective Headgear Rule DR120.6 Current USEF helmet policy will be strictly enforced. HELMET RULE EFFECTIVE APRIL 1, 2013: From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse a any time on the competition grounds, including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para-Equestrian tests, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted. Unless jackets are waived, while in the competition ring, exhibitors wearing protective headgear must wear a short, dark jacket, dark tailcoat (only permitted for tests above Fourth Level), or Armed Services or police uniform (if eligible), dark hat covers (where applicable) and must otherwise conform to DR120 (see GR801).

Reminder All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at

The listed rules are only general and are subject to change at the discretion of the Board of Directors of USEF.

MANAGEMENT RIGHTS AND SHOW POLICIES

Show Management reserves the right to change officials, rotate rings, limit entries, add, combine or cancel classes insufficiently filled, modify the schedule or reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors, and modify or cancel awards and/or make whatever changes are required by circumstances to the competition specifications listed herein.

Show Management reserves the right to refuse or require withdrawal of an entry, accept conditionally, or to cancel anyentries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, and/or prohibit entries deemed sufficient by Show Management without claims for damages.

Every horse entered for competition will comply with the rules of the horse show management, but management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold this horse show and the officials and employees of the show blameless for any loss or accident to his horse, employees, equipment, which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise.

Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judges or officials, on the part of the owner, manager/trainer, rider, or groom shall disqualify the horse, and the owner shall forfeit his entry fee and other fees.

Show Management reserves to itself the power to prohibit any person from attending or showing a horse in the ring and to remove any groom or horse from the show without being liable for compensation.

No person will be allowed in the show ring during the time of except the exhibitor and those having official or requested duties to perform.

It is the tradition of the show that riders be correctly attired for the class in question, that attendants be neatly dressed and the horses properly presented. Management may in its discretion bar any person from entering the ring if not suitably presented to appear before an audience.

Show Management reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions regarding or arising out of any incident in the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Show management; their decision will be final.

USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of over 100 independent organizations throughout the United States with a member-ship of nearly 30,000 members, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.

Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program

The USDF Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program recognizes adult amateurs competing in equitation and promotes correct seat, position, and use of the aids in dressage. An Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class presented by Big Dee's Tack and Vet Supply will be held in conjunction with each of the nine USDF Regional Dressage Championship competitions, providing adult amateurs with additional opportunity for recognition. Ribbons awarded through 8th Place and gift certificates awarded to top three riders.

Adult amateurs wishing to qualify to compete in an Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final may do so by meeting the following requirements.

Qualifying Requirements

To be eligible for the USDF Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class, rider must have

- Earned a score of 70% or higher in any dressage seat equitation class (except walk/trot) at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Dressage competition within the qualifying period of the applicable regional championship.
- b) Qualified to compete in any regional dressage championship class (excluding freestyles).

Membership Requirements

- Rider must have a USDF Participating Membership at the time the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Rider must be an adult amateur, in accordance with GR1306 of the USEF rules, and be designated with USEF as an adult
 amateur when the score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Owner must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Horse must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.

Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct applicable numbers (USDF and USEF) for horse, owner, rider, and trainer, before the day(s) of the competition.

The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards. <u>USDF Membership Benefits:</u> USDF is dedicated to education, the recognition of achievement, and promotion of dressage. For details on member benefits, including educational programs, awards, and other opportunities, refer to the *USDF Member Guide* or the USDF website at www.usdf.org.

This competition is recognized by USDF for 2022

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders

and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USI Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USI Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not
 actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian
 or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline,
 exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan VISDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF- licensed/USDF-recognized competitions a

participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program and the USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program. **Business Membership (BM):** A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Adequan (USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$80. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan /USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- On the USDF website: www.usdf.org. You can submit the application online or download the form and fax or mail it to the USDF office.
- In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date accepted by the competition secretary, provide the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.



2022 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships

A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), and recognized by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year. The Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF website at www.usdf.org. Please refer to the 2021 USDF Member Guide for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying and Championships

All memberships and registrations/recordings must be correct and current at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Rider:

- Must have a USDF Participating* Membership (PM).
- Must have a USEF membership (Junior Active, Senior Active,

or Life). Horse:

- Must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR).
- Must have a USEF (Annual or Lifetime) Horse recording.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s). A horse is not required to have breed registry papers.

Owner:

 Must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Junior Active, Senior Active, Life, or Recorded Farm (with Active Farm Owner). If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both activeUSEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership and must be the owner of record with USEF and USDF. For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.

Minimum Qualifying Scores: One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for Training Level through Grand Prix, in three divisions: open, adult amateur and junior/young rider. FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider classes have only one respective division. Freestyles have only open divisions.

For and in consideration of United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. dba US Equestrian ("USEF") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a USEF sanctioned, licensed or approved event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities and ("USEF Event" or "USEF Events"); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors,, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual repre-

sentations pursuant to this Agreement (the "Agreement"):

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. RIDER'S RELEASE, WAIVER OF LIABILITY AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, I understand and acknowledge that activities involving horses ("Equine Activities"), including but not limited to the mounting, riding, walking, dismounting, grooming, training, handling, feeding, and otherwise being in the physical proximity of horses is a dangerous activity which produces a foreseeable risk of mortal or serious personal injury and/or property loss to the participant in such activity as well as to the person or property of others; and

WHEREAS, I understand and recognize and warrant that this Release, Waiver of Liability and Indemnity Agreement ("Release") is being voluntarily and intentionally signed and agreed to, and that in signing this Release I know and understand that this Release may further limit the liability of equine professionals to include any activity, whatsoever, involving horses, including death, personal injury and/or damage to property.

WHEREAS, I recognize and agree that the equine professional(s) at SVE, CDS Foothills Chapter and National Dressage Pony Cup has/have made reasonable and prudent efforts to determine my ability to engage in the "Equine Activity", and has/have sufficient knowledge of my equine and horseback riding skills as for me to relieve, release and hold harmless said equine professional(s) from any continuing duty to monitor my Equine Activities.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of being granted access and/or use of the facilities of Starr Vaughn Equestrian, Inc. a California corporation ("SVE") and for other good and valuable consideration, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, I agree as follows:

1. Assumption of the Risk. - (c) This release is intended to release, waive and discharge, in advance, SVE, CDS Foothills Chapter and National Dressage Pony Cup, together with its owners, occupants, tenants, subtenants, employees, officers, directors and their respective affiliates or persons of any one or more of them, from and against any liability arising out of or connected in any way with my or my guests or invitees engaging in any Equine Activities on the SVE premises or in any activity in which an SVE representative is required to attend on my behalf, and/or my or my guests or invitees presence on the SVE premises, even though such liability may be attributable, in full orin part, to the negligence, recklessness or misconduct of one or more of such persons or entities.

Binding Nature of Agreement. I agree that this Agreement shall be binding on my personal representatives, heirs and assigns.


